RESULTS 2023

GCSE

Results were impressive in English, with almost three quarters of students achieving a pass and nearly 70% of students passing Maths. Outstanding results were also achieved in Art, where 87% of students were awarded a grade 6 or above. There were a large number of students who achieved the highest grade of a 9 in a wide range of subjects. A total of 43 grade 9s were achieved, 72 grade 8s and 112 grade 7s, bucking the national trend which has seen a reduction in these highest grades being awarded.



A Level

Debden Park School Sixth Form achieved its best ever set of A Level exam results in the summer of 2023. Almost half of grades achieved were A*-B, in the first year that exams have taken place since 2019.

We are delighted once again to see our students going on to study at leading universities, including Lewis Bennett, who is going on to study Physics at King's College, London, and Kitty Spurdle will now go on to University of Exeter to study Geography.

A number of our sixth formers have also gained places on very competitive degreeapprenticeship courses, including our Executive Head Boy, Jacob Elson, who has started as a trainee-solicitor with a top UK firm having achieved straight A*s at A Level.

OUR CURRICULUM

Our curriculum inspires a love of learning through stimulating and engaging learning experience. These experiences excite and challenge our students to become independent, resilient, inquisitive, community minded, cultural subject experts. Through a 7 year journey, our curriculum directly develops the ambition and aspiration of all students, enabling every student to become an expert in their chosen field.

At Key Stage 3, students follow a balanced and broad curriculum, covering Art, Dance, Drama, English, Geography, History, Computing, Maths, Modern Foreign Languages, Music, PE, RE, PSHE, Science and Technology. In addition to this, a host of enrichment programmes, including Better Together Days, BE weeks, performing arts, sport and subject based clubs develop students' knowledge and passions still further.

At the start of Year 10 students begin to focus on the curriculum areas that inspire them, and in which they aim to become experts by the end of Year 13. English, Maths and Science form the core of our curriculum, for their intrinsic value, and because they enable access to so many other subjects. Guided by our careers curriculum, we enable students to study 4 optional subjects of choice. Options include Art, Dance, Drama, Food Technology, French, Spanish, Geography, History, Computer Science, Media, Music, Music Production, Photography, PE, RE, Resistant Materials, Sociology and Triple Science (Biology, Chemistry and Physics).

OUR SIXTH FORM

At Key Stage 5, our Sixth Form offers a wide range of A-level courses that both build on those subjects learnt at GCSE as well as offering opportunities to study new and exciting areas such as Psychology and Economics. Students focus on 3 main areas of study in the subjects that inspire them. Together with the pastoral support and career guidance we offer to all our students, these courses allow our students to build directly on the knowledge and skills developed with us at Key Stage 4, while preparing them for a future beyond Sixth Form at University or their chosen career. Since starting our Sixth Form, we have been delighted to see our students move onto careers and degree-apprenticeships with some of the countries top employers, as well as going on to study courses such as medicine, engineering and law at many of the best universities in the country, including Oxford, Cambridge and other Russell Group institutions.

Our vision is one of rigour and compassion: we provide our students with a rigorous A Level education to ensure examination success and pave the way for a bright future. We believe in a compassionate approach where we strive to support our students and ensure that they partake in activities that develop skills beyond the formal curriculum.

At Debden Park High School, our Sixth Formers have the exciting opportunity to continue their education at an establishment they know will give them the very best in teaching and learning. They study in a purpose built, beautiful building,

Throughout all Key Stages, each teacher's aim is to ensure that all lessons are exciting and challenging, and to enable all students to succeed in their learning.

Students learn best if they experience a dynamic range of teaching styles throughout the day and are given bespoke opportunities that stimulate their thinking. We want our students to understand that successful learning is about enjoying how to work hard.

We aim to use the latest technology to enable all our students and staff to work efficiently and effectively to face the future. We have exceptionally high levels of computer provision throughout the school, computer aided design facilities, interactive whiteboards in every classroom, electronic registration, 24/7 access to student academic data and attendance records via the school website. We also have a cashless restaurant.

Chromebooks for All Scheme

At Debden, we know that learning never stops, and we strive to ensure our students always have the best opportunities for learning. All Debden students use Google Enterprise Apps suite for every aspect of their digital work, all stored safely and securely in one place, online. Students access all of their home learning (prep) through Google Classroom, and complete it in Google Enterprise Apps like Google classroom, drive and docs. Each Google Classroom is a knowledge organiser for each subject, and completely bespoke to each student, containing all their previous learning in one place, feedback from teachers, assessments and links to many other aspects of online learning. However, students do not just use Chromebooks and Google classroom at home, they use these learning tools during many lessons as well to enhance collaborative learning, accelerated learning and streamline the feedback to students in so many ways. Over the last few years we have developed our use of Chromebooks and Google classroom in school, and at home to support students' learning, offer direct support guidance and feedback, and present learning opportunities, both collaborative and independent that simply are not possible without them. Google classroom, and Google Apps have enabled students and staff to teach and learn together more effectively. By having all of our students and staff on one dedicated platform, we are able to spend time learning, not logging in!

> We are further integrating Google classroom into our real classrooms, and all of our new year 7 students in September 2024 will purchase their own Chromebook (for as little as £12.00 per month) that they bring to school daily, ensuring they will always have access to the learning tools they need, both within lessons and at home, to be able to access outstanding teaching and learning.







OUR TEAM



At Debden Park High School we believe that teachers and students should work together as a team. On the sports field, on the stage or in the classroom, we are stronger when we can support each other and share common goals.

We look at data from primary school tests, school assessments and Nationally referenced tests to set challenging expectations for the attainment and progress of every student. These are based on high aspirations and detailed teacher led discussions.

Working together means making the most of our skills and abilities to achieve the highest possible standards. We promote a team approach throughout our school and relish the challenges provided through competition. We do not accept second best for or from any member of our school community. We aim to win – together.

Students and parents receive updated information on students' assessments. Students know what they have to do to make progress in every subject, and are confident of receiving full support from their tutors and class teachers. We involve parents by ensuring that they know exactly how well they have achieved



so far, and most importantly how they can move forward in their learning. We know that communication between parents, students and teachers is vital in reaching our shared goals, so from our online live reporting system to parent consultation days, we promote constant contact between home and school. All teachers' direct line telephone numbers and email addresses are available to parents to aid communication. We involve parents in decisions about the way that we run our school, and recognise the vital part that parents play in supporting the learning of their own children.

Our Student Voice Leadership Team, known as the Student BE Team, drive our 10 BE characteristics which we want our students to BE. Our Executive Team along with the deputies, Debden Hearts and prefects, made up of students across Years 7 to 13 are responsible for leading initiatives linked to the BE, alongside the priorities of the school. They are involved in leading and supporting enrichment activities, organising and running charity events, supporting staff with feedback on teaching and learning, leading student lunches and supporting the welfare and well-being of students. All students have the opportunity to apply to be part of the Student BE Team and we encourage our students' to BE involved in as many opportunities as possible. We ensure our students have the opportunity every term to reflect on their BE journey and students produce outstanding reflections, known as BE Successful statements.









Whatever skills and interests our students have, we aim to provide them with an opportunity to develop. We recognise that learning is more than working in lessons. We have many after school clubs including the "Think Tank" that help support an excellent programme of out of hours learning provision, offering a wide range of opportunities for students to extend their learning beyond the constraints of the timetabled day. We have an extensive Learning Resources Centre, where students are encouraged to further develop their independent learning skills; the most successful learners are also independent learners. At DPHS, students are expected to complete home 'PREP' each evening. PREP tasks will be set via Google Classroom which deepen their understand and consolidate learning. The tasks are designed to develop inquisitive minds and strengthen the knowledge gained in class.

ADMISSIONS 2024/25

Debden Park High School admits 180 students in Year 7. All Year 7 admissions are handled by the Local Education Authority and we adhere strictly to its Admission Policy as follows :

*Looked after Children, Children in public care, and those who have been in care and have been subsequently adopted or have been made subject of a residence order or special guardianship, including those children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted will be given first priority ahead of all other applications.

*Children of staff. This would mean TKAT employees who work at Debden Park High School, who have been employed for a minimum of 2 years before application.

*A relevant sibling is a child who has a brother, sister, adopted brother or sister or stepbrother or stepsister living in the same family unit in the same family household and address who attends Debden Park High School in any year group, irrespective of place of residence. A sibling link to a child in Year 11, or Year 12, will only be taken to exist at the time of application and determination where the brother or sister has completed their statutory education at Debden Park High School and where there is an intention that the Year 11 child will be returning to the school for a post 16 course of study. Children residing in the same household as part of an extended family such as cousins, will not be treated as siblings. In the case of twins or triplets etc. both or all will be offered places

*Remaining applications

Special Educational Needs Children with Debden Park High School as the named school on their EHCP will be admitted regardless of criteria.

In the event of over subscription within any of the above criteria, priority will be determined by the straight line distance from home to school, those living closest being given highest priority.

SAFEGUARDING POLICY

Debden Park High School takes seriously its responsibility to protect and safeguard the welfare of children and young people in its care. We believe that 'the welfare of the child is paramount', Children's Act 1989. We work together with all agencies to provide the over arching system for safeguarding children as laid down within the Education Act of 2002. The designated staff at Debden Park High School are Mrs Porter (Director of Behaviour for Learning) and Mrs Ali (Safeguarding and Well- Being Officer), and other designated staff are Ms Mason, Ms Rees, Mr Powell and Ms Buisson.

Any adult may be in a position to notice or be concerned about abuse occurring to a student in school or in the home environment. This must be reported immediately to the designated person. Section 175 of the Education Act 2002 places a statutory responsibility on the Governing Body to have policies and procedures in place that safeguard and promote the welfare of children who are pupils of the school. The policies we follow apply to everyone employed in a role (paid or volunteer) working with children and who are likely to be seen by the children as a safe and trustworthy adult. SEN AND DISABILITIES

Students with Disabilities

Debden Park High School admits students with disabilities providing they meet the admission criteria, or Debden Park High School is named in an EHCP. Students with disabilities have access to all buildings within the school.

The school is a modern building and as such follows the guidance in the SEN and Disability Act. In the main School building and the Hive, we have a disabled chair lift and passenger lift which gives access to the first floor. There are accessible toilets on each corridor of both buildings. Adjustable desks are available for wheelchair users. We have four disabled parking bays. There are no steps into the buildings. The space within the classroom is limited. A child in a wheelchair may need assistance getting in and out of a classroom as the doors are all of a standard size and are heavy to push open.

Students with Special Educational Needs

The school's Special Educational Needs Policy covers every aspect of the school and is monitored by all Middle Leaders and the SENDCo. Students with learning difficulties are supported according to their individual needs, in line with the school's SEND Policy and the SEND Code of Practice.

OUR SCHOOL DAY

Our school Year is split into 6 terms.

Our timetable spreads across 2 weeks. Each day (except Tuesday) is made up of 1 period lasting half an hour which is spent in tutor groups and 5 hour long lessons. Tutors have the opportunity to focus on the academic progress of each student, as well as supporting them with their independent learning and their preparation for their exams and future education. In addition to the learning within the timetabled lessons, there are numerous enrichment activities, which enable students to work together across Year groups. They are hugely popular and range from PE clubs, Science Experiments Club, Creative Writing Club, Film Club to a great selection of Expressive Arts Clubs. We pride ourselves on the variety of learning opportunities that are available for students at all times of the day. On Tuesdays the school day finishes at 2.45pm for students to allow staff to participate in an extensive continual professional development programme.

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
